Bilkis Bano case: SC orders convicts to return to jail

Bench quashes remission, says Gujarat gov't suppressed facts

THE SUPREME COURT on Monday struck down the relief granted by the Gujarat government in August 2022 to 11 men who were sentenced to life for the gang rape of Bilkis Bano and murder of her family members during the 2002 riots, and ordered them surrender to jail authorities within two weeks.

In its order, a bench of Justice BV Nagarathna and Justice Ujjal Bhuyan said the Gujarat state's decision to grant remission to convicts was "an instance of usurpation of jurisdiction and... of abuse of discretion" and that the Gujarat state "acted in tandem and was complicit" with the convicts. Remission means a reduction in sentence imposed on a person convicted of a crime. The Supreme Court said Gujarat was not the "appropriate government" to decide on the remission plea of the 11 men convicted for the "grotesque and diabolical crime... driven by communal hatred". The bench pointed out that Section 432(7)(b) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, which deals with the power of remission, clearly indicates that the State within which the offender is sentenced, is the appropriate Government to pass an order of remission and not the one where the crime took place or where the convict was imprisoned.

Bilkis Bano was gangraped and her three-year-old daughter was among the 14 people killed by a mob including the 11 men, on March 3, 2002, during the riots in Limkheda

taluka of Gujarat's Dahod district. She was pregnant at the time. The 11 men in the Bilkis Bano rape and murder of her family members were convicted in 2008 by a CBI court in Mumbai in the state of Maharashtra. The Supreme Court had transferred the trial in the case from Gujarat to Maharashtra in 2004 citing "exceptional circumstances".

Following the writ petition of one of the convicts — Radheshyam Shah, who had completed 15 years and 4 months in jail, the Supreme Court had on May 13, 2022, ordered that the Gujarat government was the appropriate government to decide his remission plea in accordance with the state's 1992 remission and premature release policy.

Following the Supreme Court's May 13, 2022, order in Shah's case, the Gujarat government had on August 15, 2023, released the 11 convicts under its 1992 remission policy.

It had cited a "unanimous" recommendation of the Jail Advisory Committee (JAC) to grant the convicts remission on grounds of "good behaviour".

Casting the state of Gujarat for not filing a review petition seeking correction of the May 13, 2022, order by another bench of the Supreme

Court, the bench comprising Justice Nagarathna and Justice Bhuyan, said, "Had the state of Gujarat filed an application seeking review of the said order and impressed upon this court that it was not the appropriate government, but the state of Maharashtra... ensuing litigation would not have arisen at all. On the other hand... the state of Gujarat has usurped the power of state of Maharashtra and passed the orders of remission based on the order of this court dated May 13, 2022 which in our view is a nullity in law."

"This is exactly what this court had apprehended at the previous stages of this case and had intervened on three earlier occasions in the interest of truth and justice by transferring the investigation of the case to the CBI, and the trial to the Special Court at Mumbai," the bench said Monday. The Supreme Court held the May 13, 2022 judgement "nullity and non est in law" since it said "the order was sought by suppression of material facts as well as by misrepresentation of facts and therefore, fraudulently obtained at the hands of this Court".

Consequently, "all proceedings taken pursuant to the said order also stand vitiated and are non est in the eye of law", it said.

Feels like I can breathe again: Bilkis

"IT FEELS LIKE a stone the size of a mountain has been lifted from my chest, and I can breathe again. This is what justice feels like."

Hours after the Supreme Court quashed the early release granted by the Gujarat government to 11 convicts in the Bilkis Bano case, she said, in a statement released to *The Indian Express* through her advocate, that "today is truly the New Year for me."

"I have wept tears of relief. I smiled for the first time in over a year and half. I have hugged my children... I thank the honourable Supreme Court of India for giving me, my children and women everywhere this vindication and hope in the promise of equal justice for all," she said.

She also thanked those who have stood in her support: "I have stood before, and I say again today, journeys like mine can never be made alone. I have had my husband and my children by my side. I have had my friends who have given me so much love at a time of such hate, and held my hand at each difficult turn. I have had an extraordinary lawyer, advocate Shobha Gupta, who has walked with me unwaveringly for over 20 long years, and who never allowed me to lose hope in the idea of justice."

Advocate Gupta, who represented Bilkis in the SC, told *The Indian Express* that the apex court had considered the long periods of parole granted to the convicts during their stay in Godhra sub-jail, while also indicating the Gujarat government "forcing the order for one convict to release all 11.

'Welfare benefits should reach all'

ADDRESSING BENEFICIARIES OF government welfare schemes over teleconferencing on Monday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the purpose of the Viksit Bharat Yatra was to ensure that no eligible person is deprived of the benefits of such schemes.

He said it was his resolve to make India a developed country by 2047. Timed right before the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the yatra that has reached 110 million people in 50 days, is touring villages across the country to spread awareness about the government's welfare schemes so that more people can apply for the benefits.

PM Modi said: "Sometimes people are not aware of the schemes. Our government sees reaching out to villages across India as our responsibility. About 1.2 million new applications for Ujjwala have been received



since this yatra started; 20 million health check-ups have been done during this yatra. About 10 million TB check-ups and 2.2 million sickle cell anaemia check-ups have been done."

He added, "These are rural. Dalit, backward, and Adivasi people. Earlier, they faced reaching doctors difficult, now doctors are reaching them for check-ups. Up to ₹5 lakh insurance, free kidney dialysis, and cheap medicines are now available for them. The yatra has proved a boon for the poor."

India is a 'great friend': Hasina

DESCRIBING INDIA AS a "great friend" of Bangladesh, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on Monday said that the two neighbours have resolved many problems bilaterally, a day after she won an overwhelming majority in the general elections and secured a record fourth straight term.

The 76-year-old leader, who has been ruling the strategically located South Asian nation since 2009, won a fifth overall term in the one-sided election on Sunday, which witnessed a low turnout.

"India is a great friend of Bangladesh. They have supported us in 1971 and also in

1975. They gave shelter to me and my sister and my other family members," she said, referring to her period in exile when she stayed in India for six years after the killing of her family members.

In August 1975, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, his wife and their three sons were assassinated in their home by military officers. His daughters Hasina and Rehana survived the purge as they were abroad.

"We consider India as our next-door neighbour. We had many problems but we resolved it bilaterally. So, I really appreciate that we have a wonderful relationship with India," she said while responding to a question. —PTI

Congress, AAP hold seat-sharing talks

THE CONGRESS AND THE AAP discussed seat-sharing prospects for the Lok Sabha polls in Punjab, Delhi and other states, and decided to meet again to give a final shape to the arrangements between the two key constituents of the INDIA opposition bloc.

The Remote e-voting module will be disabled by CSCL for voting beyond 5:00 pm (IST) on Tuesday, January 30, 2024.

The facility for voting through the e-voting system will also be made available during the EGM. Shareholders attending the EGM through the VCO/AVM facility who have not cast their votes by remote e-voting will be able to vote during the EGM.

Members are requested to note that:

- Members who have cast their votes by remote e-voting prior to the EGM may attend the EGM through VCO/AVM but will not be entitled to cast their vote again. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by a member, they shall not be allowed to change it subsequently or vote again.
- The voting rights of members shall be in proportion to their shares of the said equally share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date.
