The focus should be on providing assistance in terms of building of institutions and capacities so that the bottom of solutions can come up originally in accord with the ethos of the nations being assisted, the Minister stated. "We offer enhanced defence partnerships to friendly foreign nations which are accommodative of nations' priorities and capacities. We want to build, launch, create and develop with you. We wish to create a symbiotic relationship in which we can learn from each other, grow together and create a win-win situation for one and all," he stated. Shared prosperity of the world requires greater coordination among all nations in diverse areas of which the domain of defence and security are of most importance. Today, collective security has become sine qua non for prosperity and development. Terrorism, illegal arms, drugs smuggling, and human trafficking pose significant security threats to the whole world. Though these are not new, their scope and scale are unprecedented. Therefore, to counter these threats, there is a need to devise new strategies, he explained. India does not believe in dealing with such security issues in old patterns or neo colonial paradigms. "We consider all nations

as equal partners. That is why we do not believe in dumping external supra-national solutions to a country's internal problems. We do not believe in sermons or cut and write solutions which do not respect the national values and countries in need of assistance," the Minister insisted. "It is our endeavour to transcend the hierarchical relationship of buyer and seller to the development and co-production model, whether we are a buyer or seller. "We are a major defence buyer as well as a significant exporter. When we are procuring defence equipment from our valued partner nations, very often they are sharing technical know-how, setting up manufacturing plants in India and working with our local farms or various sub-systems," he said. He further stated that wherever India is exporting defence equipment, full support is offered towards the capability development. India has never been a closed country and has always been open to new ideas or thoughts from all over the world. "Our past openness continues to shape the present and future. Unfettered to any faction or alliance of one group of nations against another, we have worked ceaselessly for the upliftment of all nations, developing ones in particular," he said. India always stood for a rule based international order," he added.

Three days after marriage, couple dies in accident near Andhra-Odisha border

The two-wheeler on which the couple was heading to Odisha was knocked down by a tractor on the Andhra-Odisha border. The newly-wed couple was on their way to the house of Pravalka's parents, for the first time after the wedding. Venu, working in a garment shop in Ichchapuram town of Srikakulam district, and Subhadra, a resident of Berhampur in Odisha, entered the wedlock on February 10 at a ceremony held at Simhalacham temple in Vishakhapatnam district. They hosted a reception for relatives and friends at Ichchapuram on February 12. The next day, Venu and Subhadra started for Berhampur on a motor bike. The bride was happy while leaving for her first visit to parents' house after the wedding. However, the fate proved to be cruel for the cheerful couple. When the couple had almost reached Berhampur, a tractor hit their vehicle. While Subhadra died on the spot, a critically injured Venu succumbed after he was shifted to a hospital at Berhampur. The families of both the bride and the bridegroom plunged into a gloom. Subhadra's parents and other family members waiting for her, were shocked to learn about the couple's death.

Anti-incumbency wave is brewing against BRS, BJP Govts: Shabbir



Kamareddy, Feb 14 (IANS) : Former Minister Mohammed Ali Shabbir on Tuesday claimed that an anti-incumbency wave was brewing against BRS and BJP Govts among people and it would bring Congress party back to power in the next Assembly elections. He was speaking to media persons at Congress district headquarters after participating in the 'Haath Se Haath Jodo' campaign in several areas of Kamareddy today. TPCC Mahila Congress President Sunitha Rao and many senior leaders also participated in the padayatra. Shabbir Ali said that the 'Haath Se

Haath Jodo' campaign has been receiving tremendous response across Telangana State. "The main intention of the 'Haath Se Haath Jodo' campaign was to carry the message of unity and brotherhood given by Congress leader Rahul Gandhi through his Bharat Jodo Yatra. When we started meeting people during door-to-door padayatra and had interactions, we observed that a huge anti-incumbency wave was brewing among them. They are not happy with the performance of both the BRS and BJP Govts," he said. The Congress leader said that

the BRS Govt completely failed to fulfill the aspirations of the people of Telangana. "None of the promises made to the people by Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao in either 2014 or 2018 were fulfilled. The implementation of the welfare scheme was only symbolic. However, using unethical marketing tactics, it was highlighted as if Telangana has emerged as a model State," he said. Citing examples, Shabbir Ali said that about 40 lakh people in Telangana, including nearly 24-25 lakh qualified youth registered with the Telangana Public Service Commission (TSPSC), were jobless. Instead of taking measures to tackle the problem of unemployment, KCR Govt is creating hype about filling 1.30 lakh vacancies despite the fact more than 1 lakh posts are still vacant. "KCR had promised in the 2018 elections that his government will give an unemployment allowance of Rs. 3,016 per month to all jobless youth.

'Swindled lakhs of crores of public money', Cong leader moves SC seeking probe against Adani

The plea filed by Jaya Thakur through advocate Varinder Kumar Sharma urged the top court to direct probe against Adani group of companies through chairman and his associates who have swindled lakhs of crores of public money and money of the government exchequer, by various investigating agencies, i.e. CBI, ED, DRI, CBI, EIB, NCB, SEBI, RBI, SFO under the supervision and monitoring of the sitting judge of the apex court. "To direct the investigating agencies to investigate the role of Respondent No. 11 (LIC) & 12 (SEBI) to invest huge amount of public money in the PFO of the Adani Enterprises @ Rs 3200/- per share whereas the prevailing market rate of shares of Adani Enterprises in the secondary market was Rs 1800/- per share approximately," said the plea. The plea contended that subse-

quent to disclosure made by Hindenburg Research report on January 24, the share price of the Adani Group of companies came down drastically and reached to almost 50 per cent of the price prevailing on January 24, in various stock markets in India and abroad, due to which the millions of common men of this country lost more than Rs 10 lakh crore. The apex court is already hearing two petitions in connection with the Hindenburg report controversy. On Monday, the Central government informed the Supreme Court that the existing structure, which includes the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) and others agencies, are fully equipped to handle the situation which occurred after Hindenburg report on Adani group, and it would not oppose the court's suggestion to constitute a committee to strengthen the existing regime. It stressed that the court would per-

mit it to suggest the remit of that committee with possible suggestions of names of the committee. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the Centre, submitted before a bench headed by Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud said: "Our instructions are that the existing structure - SEBI and other agencies - are fully equipped not only regime wise but otherwise also, in taking care of the situation. "However, responding to suggestions which fell from your lordships, the government has no objection in constituting a committee," Mehta stressed that the remit of the committee should be very relevant because any unintentional message to the international investors and domestic investors that even a regulator or statutory monitoring authority also needs a monitoring by a committee appointed by the Supreme Court may have some adverse impact on the flow of money.

The MP, who remains critical of state Congress chief A. Revanth Reddy, had sparked a row by not campaigning for Congress candidate in the by-election. The Congress leadership had issued him a show cause notice after a voice recording went viral on social media in which Venkat Reddy is heard asking a Congress leader to support his brother. A video clip had also gone viral in which Venkat Reddy is heard predicting that Congress will lose the by-election to Mmmgode Assembly seat. Venkat Reddy, however, termed the audio and video clips as fake. The MP had also stayed away from Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra when it passed through Telangana.

Four persons held for murder

Hyderabad, Feb 14 (IANS) : Four persons who had allegedly murdered a rowdy shooter at Falaknuma a week ago were arrested by the police on Tuesday. The police seized three knives and other articles from them. The arrested persons are Mohd Asif, (22), Shaik Khaled (26), Mohammed Afroz Khan (21) and Mohammed Nadeem Qureshi (24), all with criminal records in different police stations. Awoman, Shakera Begum, who is mother of Asif and had allegedly instigated him to kill the victim Mohd Ayaz, is absconding. ACP Falaknuma, Shaik Jahangir, said Ayaz, against whom a rowdy sheet is maintained at the Kalapathar police station, was involved in the murder of a man Mohd Ali in 2015. The prime suspect in the murder case Asif is a relative of Mohd Ali. Six months ago, Ayaz took a house on rent near the house of Asif and four months ago some quarrel took place between Shakera Begum and Ayaz. Since both the families were having grudge against each other, Asif planned to kill Ayaz with his friends. "On February 6, when Ayaz was travelling in his pick-up truck, Asif along with Khaled, Afroz and Nadeem waylaid him near Majesty hair salon, Nawab Sahab kunta road. All of them attacked him with knives resulting in injuries and subsequent death," said the ACP. A case under Section 302 of IPC was booked against him and police arrested the four persons. All of the arrested have been remanded.
